


Mario Tschan: Welcome to the General Assembly of 2025. Thank you all for joining. We will record the meeting to ease the preparation of the Minutes. Afterwards the recording will be deleted.




Mario Tschan: The General Assembly is the main part of LS<sup>2</sup>, the highest level of our organization. It needs to approve and vote on all essential actions.

Mario Tschan: A reminder – the main objective of LS<sup>2</sup> is to promote scientific activities and establish a network in all domains of Life Sciences. Particularly through the organization of conferences, lectures, and courses. We also have a special focus on the promotion of young scientists.

Mario Tschan: We now have a new Scientific Officer – Lalita Oparija-Rogenmozere. She is replacing Adela Calvente.



Mario Tschan: Please vote for today's agenda. Approved, 100% in favor.



Mario Tschan: Please vote on the Minutes of the 2024 General Assembly. Approved, 96% in favor, 4% abstain.



Mario Tschan: Here is the financial report of 2024. Income is shown on the left side. Our main income comes from membership fees and registration fees/sponsorships of the Annual Meeting and Section meetings. We also receive SCNAT funding and profits from our assets.

Mario Tschan: In the middle column we show expenses. Apart from meeting expenses and staff costs, there are also approx. 10 500 CHF in lawyer fees (Anwalt). These are from an old lawsuit against our society by a previous employee. It took a while to settle, but now the lawsuit is closed and there will be no more costs.

Mario Tschan: On the right side you can see our balance. To remind you, we are a non-profit organization, so a "big fat zero" at the end of the year would also be good. It means that our income is reinvested into our members, our Society. Unfortunately, we are ending 2024 with a negative budget, despite profits from our investments ranging around 30 000 CHF.

Mario Tschan: Several reasons impacted our budget for 2024. For example: 1) The location of Annual Meeting 2024 had less space for exhibitors (fewer booths = lower income from sponsors); 2) Companies are not willing to increase their sponsorships; 3) Profits from Section meetings are variable; 4) Last payment for lawyers as we finalize the issues with a previous employee; 5) Overlap of LS<sup>2</sup> SO employment to ensure a smooth transition.

Mario Tschan: We have also decided on several actions to improve our budget in the future and bring it out of the deficit: 1) Less administrative involvement of LS<sup>2</sup> SO in section meeting organization, already partially implemented (thank you AM2025 Chairs!) – this allows more time for fundraising; 2)

LS<sup>2</sup> office is looking for new funding opportunities, as we are now a tax-exempt/non-profit organization; 3) Increase memberships and participation at LS<sup>2</sup> AM (Please everyone - join!!!); 4) Section meeting organizers will be responsible for their budgets, as we will no longer cover their deficit. We also encourage everyone involved in the meeting organization to fundraise! Some of these actions have already helped LS<sup>2</sup> Office to gain time to work on improving our organization and its budget.


Mario Tschan: We also have some investments and savings, helping to cover the negative balances in the short-term.

Mario Tschan: Please vote on the Annual Budget. Approved, 92% in favor and 8% abstaining.




Mario Tschan: The budget forecast for 2025 depends on lots of variables. It is largely based on the income and expenses of the Annual Meeting in Fribourg. We might not end the year in profit, but we do not expect a big deficit.

Mario Tschan: Ideas on how to improve the budget are welcome, please get in touch with us.




Mario Tschan: My two-year presidency will be over in February. Simon Sprecher will become the new President, and Emi Negoshi - the new Vice-President.

Mario Tschan: Vote for Simon approved, 96% in favor. Vote for Emi: 100% in favor. Congratulations, and I look forward to working with you.



Mario Tschan: We also have some Board members who are leaving. Thank you for your valuable contributions to our Society and I wish you all the best for the future!




Mario Tschan: We have one new Board member to vote in. Patricia Boya will join the Board of Section Autophagy. Please vote.

Confirmed, 88% in favor, 12% abstain. Congrats Patricia and welcome to the Board!




Mario Tschan: The last vote will be about the new functions within the Boards. We have Vassiliki Nikoletopoulou becoming President and Patricia Boya - Vice-President of the section Autophagy. Similar changes in the Cardiovascular Biology Section — new President (Sarah Longus) and Vice-President (Lucio Barile). Also in MCB we will have a new Vice-President (Torsten Ochsenreiter). Last but not least, in Microscopy Section we will have a new President (Arne Seitz) and Vice-President (Oliver Biehlmaier).

Mario Tschan: Please vote. Approved, 96% in favor, 4% abstain.




Lalita Oparija: The membership statistics are based on the member count at the end of December 2024. We had 1012 members in 2024, almost reaching pre-Covid numbers, which is an excellent development. All Sections were able to increase their member count in 2024.




Lalita Oparija: Our largest section is still MCB. We also observe a stable increase in members belonging to more than one section, reaching 480 in 2024. This reflects the increase in interdisciplinary research and intersectionality. The benefit is that we could organize more double/multi-section meetings in the future. We have the data of overlapping members between Sections.

Lalita Oparija: However, members adding more sections to their profile also obscures the actual growth of each Section. These are not only new people joining, but also people adding more Sections to their profile.



Lalita Oparija: If we look at memberships by type, the majority of our members are Regular members, meaning postdocs and higher academic positions or company staff. Another large group is Postgraduates; these are PhD students. One section that is quite underrepresented, compared to their presence in academia, is Undergraduates. These are Bachelor's and Master's students. Despite the low membership fees for this member type and the majority of our events being free for students, we fail to recruit from this demographic. We need to think about how to make LS<sup>2</sup> and our events more interesting for them.



Lalita Oparija: If we look at where our members come from, it's mainly 3 Universities: the University of Zurich, the University of Bern, and the University of Geneva. There are still plenty of Universities, from which we could increase our member pool.

Mario Tschan: We are a very active Society. In 2024 we co-organized 11 meetings, one workshop, and one social event. Importantly, we distributed 55 prizes to young researchers, totaling over 13 thousand CHF. We also awarded 18 travel grants funded by SCNAT. These actions not only align with the main LS<sup>2</sup> objectives but also motivate young scientists to participate in our events.

Mario Tschan: Of course, there is a lot of volunteer work involved in all these events, which we highly appreciate. Thank you to everyone who participated and helped!


